## From the Directors

Dear Friends,

In 2021, POMDR and the rest of our community and the world began to operate in the new normal. The shelters filled up to pre-pandemic levels while vulnerable individuals continued to need financial assistance to care for their pets, help walking dogs, and help with temporary foster care while they were recovering from illness or injury.

Our veterinary clinic has remained busy and has enabled us to meet the needs of the community by providing veterinary care to the approximately **70** dogs who are in our program at any given time, as well as continuing to provide veterinary care to the pets of senior and low-income pet guardians.

In spite of the challenge of competing with large corporations to attract veterinary staff, as well as dealing with the ever-changing COVID climate, staff illness, and quarantine time, our organization has been able to help more senior dogs and senior people than in any year previous.

Since our inception, POMDR has rescued a total of **2,823** dogs. We also served **1,656** unique Helping Paw clients over the years.

Our goal for 2022 is to continue to provide quality veterinary care to the dogs we rescue and to be here to support the needs of senior and low-income pet guardians who would otherwise be forced to give up their beloved pets.

## Perpetual Care Program

We now have **100** pet guardians signed up for our Perpetual Care Program. These pet guardians know their dogs are guaranteed a lifetime of loving care in a POMDR foster or adoptive home if needed.





# Programs & Accomplishments

## Intakes



We took in a total of **356** dogs. **183** dogs came from guardians who could no longer care for them. **173** dogs came to us from shelters, freeing up space and resources so our local shelters can help more animals in need.

## Adoptions



Through our successful adoption program, **302** dogs found forever homes.

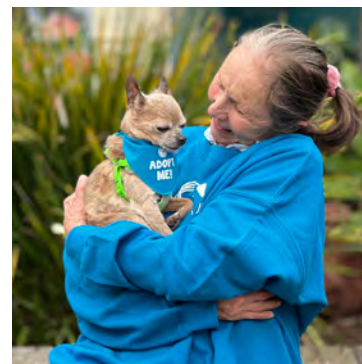
## Helping Paw Program

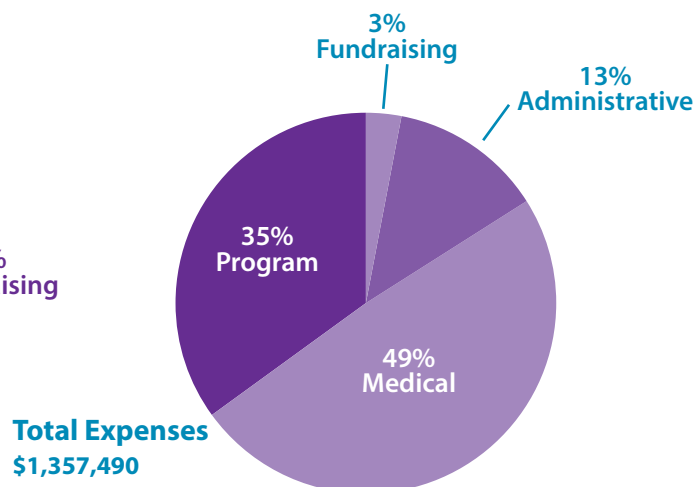
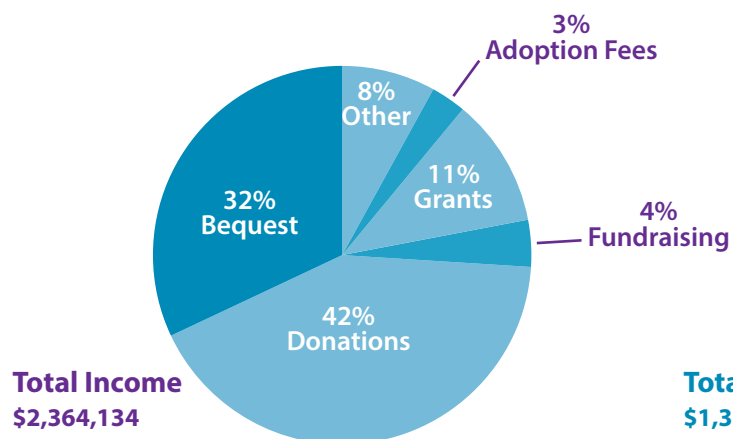
