From the Founders

Since our Top 10 CNN Heroes award at the end of 2022, Peace of Mind Dog Rescue (POMDR) has received support from across the country, enabling us to hire more veterinary staff, a dog behavior specialist and a marketing and communications manager.

Our team expansion has helped us serve more senior dogs and senior people than ever before. We have opened our clinic to more clients in need of affordable veterinary care, started providing behavior training for dogs in our program,

and have been spreading the word about senior dogs and people farther and wider than in previous years. We have rescued a total of **3,576** dogs since 2009 and have also served a total of **2,756** Helping Paw clients over the years.

Even with our expanded team, the need for our services is greater than ever. The lingering effects of the COVID-19 pandemic are ever present for us and other shelters and rescues in the community. Financial hardship, loss of housing and under-socialized dogs have increased the number of dogs entering shelters in the entire country.

In response to this, our goals are to continue to expand our affordable veterinary care, and also to restructure our intake, foster and adoption programs, relying more heavily on lead volunteers.

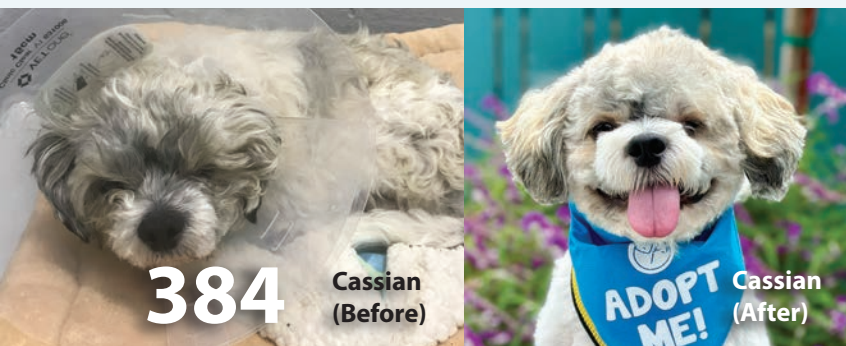
We are optimistic about the future of POMDR and remain grateful for all your support. We couldn't do this without you.

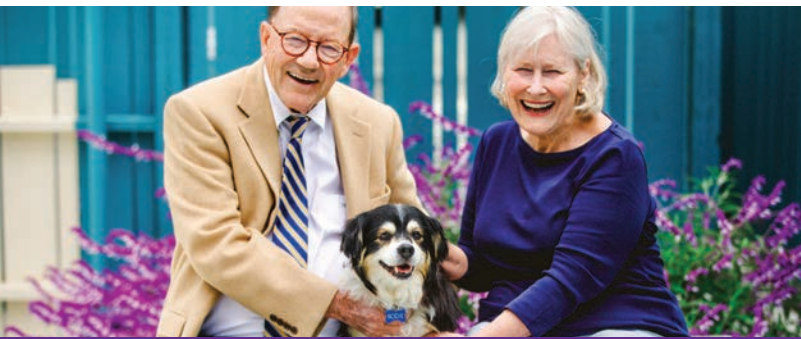

Programs & Highlights

Intakes

We rescued a total of **384** dogs. **176** dogs came to us from guardians who could no longer care for them or had passed away. **208** dogs came to us from shelters, allowing our local shelters to have the space and resources to assist more animals in need.

Adoptions

We helped **334** dogs find their forever homes through our adoption program.

Helping Paw Program

We assisted **797** seniors, hospice patients, and unhoused and low-income pet guardians. Assistance included help with veterinary expenses, temporary foster care or boarding, dog walking, and transportation to veterinary and grooming appointments.

Volunteers

Our team of **1,444** compassionate and enthusiastic volunteers provided foster care, transportation for dogs, follow-up calls to adopters, grant writing, help with social media, help at our veterinary clinic, and an array of other important behind-the-scenes tasks.

Perpetual Care Program

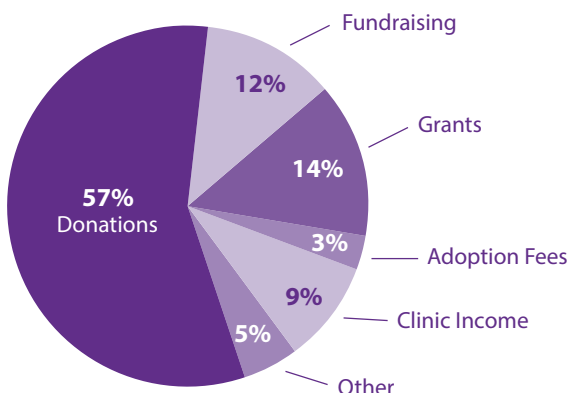

Lucky Dog Gala & For the Love of Dogs

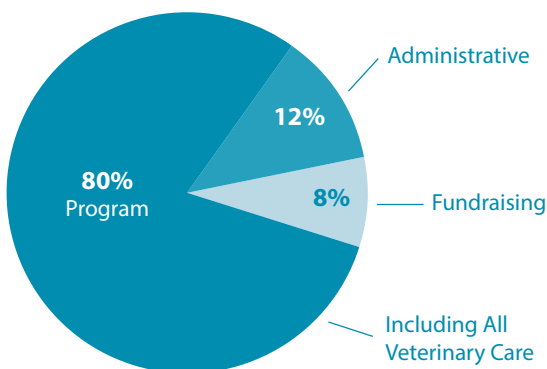
On May 25th, **188** guests attended our annual Lucky Dog Gala. We gathered at the Club at Pasadera in Monterey and raised **\$203,000**.

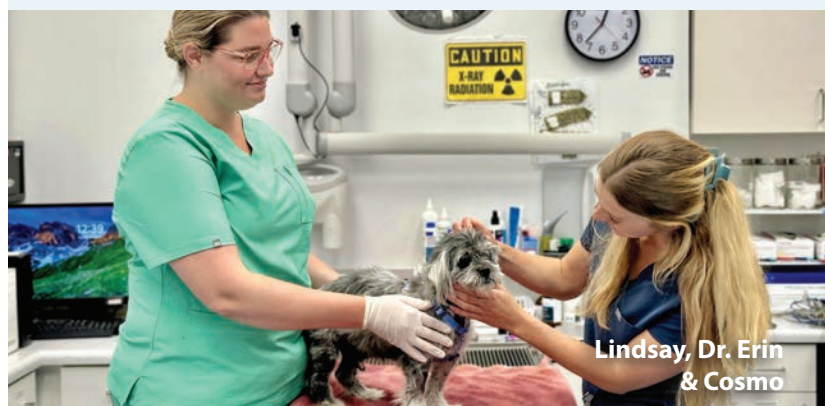
